Obituary

Elizabeth (Queenie) Lewis Jackson was born in Camden, Alabama on November 19, 1935, the eighth child of fifteen, to the late Ben and Daisy Lee Fairley Lewis. She departed this life on Thursday, January 11, 2024, at the Norwalk Hospital.

At an early age she joined the St. James A.M.E. Church and served faithfully as Secretary of the Sunday School and sang in the choir.

After completing high school and two years of college, she moved to New York and was baptized into the Baptist faith. In 1959 she moved to Norwalk, CT where she joined the Calvary Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend S.J. Williams.
