James Lee Brinkley was born on February 11, 1941 at his original family home in South Weldon, North Carolina located in Halifax County. He was the eldest of five children born to the late Jimmie and Mae Beulah Jones Brinkley. He transitioned into Eternal Rest on Tuesday, May 16, 2023.

It was at Ralph J. Bunche Elementary School in Weldon, North Carolina that James received his primary and junior high school education. He graduated from Ralph J. Bunche High School in Weldon, in the class of 1960. During his high school years, James was a notable, outstanding athlete who displayed phenomenal athletic skills and abilities as a member of the school football, basketball, baseball and track and field teams.

Nurtured in a devout Christian home, James was baptized at St. Peter's Baptist Church in Weldon, North Carolina at an early age. His family were loyal members of St. Peter's Baptist Church. There he and his siblings were active members of the church, Sunday School classes, the Junior Usher Board, the Baptist Young People's Union and Vacation Bible School, among many other ministries.

Following his high school graduation, James relocated to Stamford, Connecticut where his brother Charles and Mollye followed . After a romantic courtship with the young and attractive Glory Jarrett whom he met in 1962, James and Glory entered into Holy Matrimony on May 4, 1963. Their beautiful Wedding Ceremony was performed by the Reverend Cyril Peters at the Neighborhood House in Stamford, Connecticut. To this blessed union of sixty years was born one son, Brian K. Brinkley.

James Brinkley joined the fellowship of the Union Baptist Church on June 5, 1983. He was a faithful member of the church for forty years.

For a long period of time, Mr. Brinkley made valuable contributions as a professional employee of various corporations in Stamford, Connecticut. These industries included: The Polycast International Manufacturing Company and The Sterling Drug Company. He then served as the Head Custodian of The Bi- Cultural Day School in Stamford, Connecticut for twenty- six years until his retirement.

James possessed a vivacious personality and a vibrant sense of humor. He

was well liked by all who befriended him. He maintained a special kinship with friends at Young's Barber Shop, his friends, Joe Fields store on West Main Street and the Pool Room with whom he spent many delightful hours of frivolity. He and Glory greatly relished the memories of the glorious trips which they took to Aruba, Nassau in the Bahamas, Bermuda, Niagra Falls, Canada, Cancun, Mexico, Panama, San Juan, Puerto Rico and Numerous other locations.
