Our beloved Marshall Mobley fell asleep in death Wednesday, August 31, 2022 at 6:10 pm. Marshall was born October 9, 1938 in Unadilla, Georgia to the late James and Alphonso Mobley. He came from a large family of 10 brothers and sisters. His Mom used to say “you can’t throw a rock without hitting a Mobley or a dog.” As a youth Marshall attended schools in Dooley County, Georgia. Marshall graduated from Vienna High and Industrial School, as the valedictorian of his senior class. After graduation he attended a Junior College in St. Petersburg, Florida. Shortly thereafter he joined the United States Army and served until he was honorably discharged. After his discharge from military service, Marshall migrated to Connecticut where he was employed at Pepperidge Farm. He began his career at Pepperidge in the test kitchen but moved to sales where he worked as a District Sales Manager and Accounts Manager until his retirement after 24 years of service. One of the best days of Marshall’s life was when he married Ellen Davis Middleton on July 23, 1978. They were loving companions for 45 years in which they shared a love for Jehovah, travel and visiting family and friends. Marshall became a baptized member of the Jehovah Witnesses organization on June 16, 1993. He spiritually progressed and matured to becoming an Elder in which he encouraged and shepherded many in the Norwalk congregation.
